FAITH AS A WAY OF LIFE

In our Greek Orthodox tradition, being “faithful” involves much more than intellectual agreement with a set of doctrines. It is rooted in the word *pistis* (πίστις), which implies a deep, relational trust and a lived-out loyalty. To be “one of the faithful,” or *pistos* (πιστός), is to live in a state of constant “Amen” - a continuous “Yes” to God’s presence and His guidance in our lives.

In Orthodoxy, faithfulness is synergistic, meaning it is a collaborative participation in God’s grace. It requires our human will to actively cooperate with divine action. This is the commitment to walk the “narrow way,” recognizing that while salvation is a gift of grace, we must “work it out” by aligning our daily choices with God’s will. It is a loyalty that persists even through spiritual dryness. This “dryness” is that common but difficult experience where the emotional “feeling” of God’s presence evaporates, making prayer feel like a chore and the spiritual life feel like a desert. In these moments, faith is not a warm emotion, but a grit that remains steady despite a lack of inspiration or the heavy distractions of the world.

Faith in Action

This understanding is anchored in Hebrews 11:1, where faith is defined as the “substance” or *hypostasis* (ὑπόστασις) of things hoped for. For the Orthodox, faith is not a blind “leap into the dark.” Instead, it is a foundational encounter with reality that allows us to see the world through the lens of the Kingdom of God.

However, this vision must be translated into action; as the Apostle James reminds us, just as the body without the spirit is dead, so “faith without works is dead also.” True faithfulness is the external evidence of an internal reality, made visible through acts of love, mercy, and obedience. This journey requires the virtue of endurance, or *hypomone* (ὑπομονή), a lifelong marathon that remains unshaken even in the face of suffering or worldly pressure.

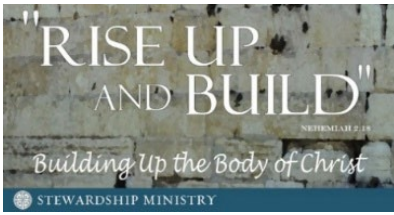
Embracing the Lenten Journey

As we experience the holy season of Great Lent, we are given a spiritual gymnasium to strengthen this endurance. This is the time to transition from “believing” to “becoming” by leaning into the traditional practices of the Church. We re-establish our daily conversation with the Creator through prayer, anchoring our souls in His presence, while simultaneously using fasting to discipline our physical desires so the spirit may lead. This process strips away the excesses that cloud our vision, allowing our internal discipline to flow outward through almsgiving. In this way, we learn to see Christ in the face of the poor and loosen the grip of materialism on our hearts, turning our internal faith into a tangible act of love.

Most importantly, we do not walk this path in isolation. The Divine Services of the Church - from the Great Canon of Saint Andrew to the Presanctified Liturgies - are specifically designed to nourish and enlighten the soul. By immersing ourselves in the liturgical life of the Church, we find our faith bolstered and our hearts encouraged, turning the Lenten journey into a true ascent toward the light of Pascha.

Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral was consecrated on February 4, 2001. To commemorate the silver anniversary of this momentous occasion, its parishioners celebrated with an elegant Champagne and Chocolate Reception at the Hellenic Cultural Center on Saturday, January 24, 2026. Rain did not deter the sold-out crowd of 150 attendees, who gathered to enjoy an extraordinary evening of fellowship with family and friends.

Co-chairpersons Helen Malachias and Sandy Bouzon greeted guests upon arrival, and Debbie Funti and Ilya Malachias presented each family a special commemorative icon that was blessed earlier that

Saturday evening at Vespers Service. The colorful icons, mounted on white marble and adorned with gold embellishments by the nuns at St. Paraskevi Monastery in Texas, were generously underwritten by the Order of St. Markella of Chios.

Upon entering the main hall, guests found the room bedecked with black linens and sheer silver overlays. Each table was adorned with vases of white flowers and burgundy accents. The floral arrangements, provided by Pam Georges of Pamela Dennis at the Rink, corresponded with the white, black, and burgundy programs and literature placed on each table.

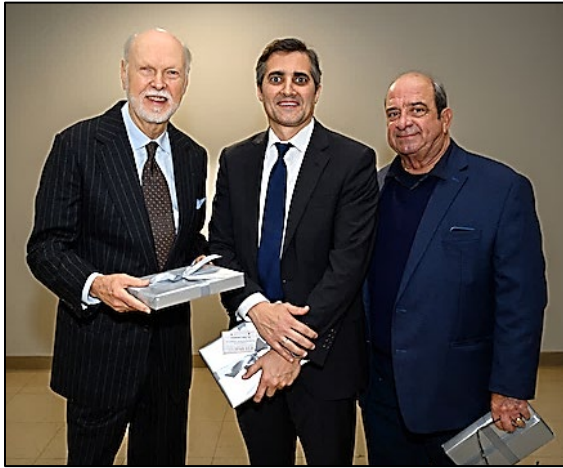
From the podium Helen Malachias welcomed guests and introduced Father George Wilson, who blessed the food and the drink. Guests were treated to French champagne and Sicilian white wine along with an endless array of passed and served hors d'oeuvres prepared by talented chefs Evangelia Bilalis and Alexandra Hirras Megilligan, who were assisted by their spouses Petros Bilalis and Danny Megilligan. Among the countless delicious offerings were shrimp and corn bisque, roasted red pepper soup, prime rib, marinated octopus, crab cakes with remoulade, fried bacalao with skordalia, octopus and potato salad, spanakopites, capocollo wrapped asparagus, and a huge selection of fruits, salads, dips, and imported Greek cheeses. It was indeed a feast worthy of such a significant celebration.



An abundance of chocolate desserts complemented the savory culinary fare. Event co-chairperson Victoria Catsulis, along with Anthoula Malachias and Gail Psilos, prepared individual servings of specialty sweets that included coconut macaroons dusted with edible silver, chocolate cheesecakes, and chocolate macadamia cookies. 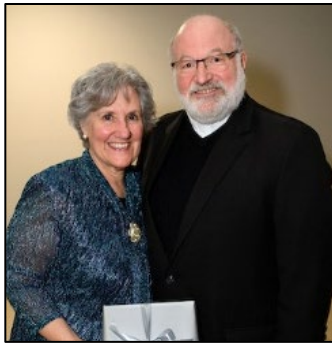
