FATHER, READ ME THE PRAYER SO I CAN RECEIVE COMMUNION

Many times, Orthodox Christians approach the priest and ask him to read them a prayer of forgiveness so they can receive Holy Communion. The prayer the faithful ask for is the Prayer of the Repentant. This prayer is written in the priest's book of prayers and services (the Euchologion) and is the last prayer read during the sacrament of Confession. Often, however, Orthodox Christians will approach their priests to have the Prayer of the Repentant read over them so they can receive forgiveness without having to confess their sins. The Prayer of the Repentant presupposes that repentance of the penitent and the sacrament of Confession have already occurred. It cannot be separated from the service. If however, repentance and confession do not precede, how can the prayer be read? For those who have confessed and repented of their sins, the reading of the prayer is simply a repetition. For those, however, who did not confess and did not repent of their sins, but still want the prayer read over them, what could its benefit be?

Many of us do not want to understand that this prayer is not simply a formality, but rather is the seal of the sacrament and describes its essence. It is the confirmation of the Sacrament of Confession before Holy Communion, and it is an essential element of our repentance and forgiveness. When we clearly realize this, then whoever of us wants to replace the Sacrament of Confession with the Prayer of the Repentant must understand that the two are not equivalent. Therefore, we should not ask for the Prayer of the Repentant at the last minute, but should prepare through Holy Confession, and in this way having confessed and repented, approach Holy Communion. However, it happens that many of us come at the last moment and demand the Prayer of the Repentant saying, "But Father, we did not do anything seriously wrong. We have fasted and are ready to receive Communion." We must understand that sin has a **heaviness** many of us do not realize. That is, many consider murder, perjury, and stealing to be sins, but they do not realize that sins they consider insignificant and small can also be deadly.

Is **hate** a small sin, that which nests in the soul of many who have not spoken for months and years, even to their own relatives and siblings? Is **immorality** a small sin, that many do not even consider a sin but a natural need, which should not prevent them from receiving Holy Communion? Is **slander** a small sin, that which causes innocent people anguish throughout their lives? Are these small sins: **lying, drunkenness, gambling, pride, envy**, ... should not these sins be forgiven by repentance and Confession? Can they be forgiven through a single prayer?

There is also a more serious issue at hand. Although many feel that all these are sins, they often hesitate to confess them, either from shame or because they are afraid that others may find out. Sometimes they do not confess them because a penance (a moral punishment) may be appointed to them. For these reasons, they ask for an easier way by requesting the Prayer of the Repentant. Their request is wrong, however, and their souls are headed down a dreadful path.

Any kind of sin is a sickness of the soul, and our Lord wants our souls to be cured. For this reason, He defined the Sacrament of Confession and repentance to be in front of the spiritual father, who has the order from God through the Bishop, to hear the sins of men, **to keep absolute secrecy**, and to throw in the furnace of forgetfulness everything he hears. All of us should present to our spiritual father the wounds of our souls, and he, with the grace of God, will pour

on them “oil and wine,” as the Samaritan poured oil and wine on the wounded man. The confessor will give us the curative training so that we may again find the way towards God. Perhaps a **penance** (a spiritual punishment) may be needed, with the purpose of strengthening the will of the one confessing. This would be in order to cut his relation with sin and break what had become a bad habit, so that he may live a true spiritual life from that time forward according to God’s Will.

This is the truth on this great matter. Everything else is foreign to the Orthodox Christian Church, and the faithful must avoid it. If we ask the faithful who receive Communion after a sincere Confession and true repentance how they feel, we will get the answer that they have felt a feeling of inexpressible joy and peace filling their souls, one they would not trade for all the treasures in the world. Anyone who approaches Holy Communion having only had the Prayer of the Repentant read over them never feels the way others do who approach after having gone to Confession. Let us then ask ourselves what we must do. May God lead us toward the right path.

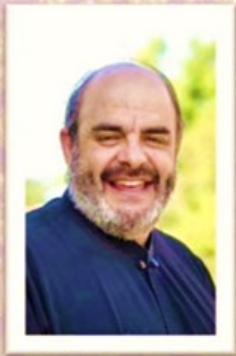

REPLACEMENT OF CATHEDRAL ORGAN

Dear parishioners, church, organizations, and friends. As many of you are now aware, the church organ in the Cathedral is not working and is beyond repair. We have had several repairs over the past years totaling thousands of dollars with no long-term benefit to the instrument. We have had technicians come recently to evaluate the organ, and they have determined it needs to be replaced.

At our recent general assembly held in January, the parishioners voted unanimously to proceed with a new purchase which will be approximately \$55,000. Rather than simply writing a check to pay this amount, the parish council is asking for donations to help offset some or all of the cost. Gifts in memory of loved ones who either played musical instruments, or sang in choral groups or gifts to honor the musical talents of friends, or family members would be appreciated and recognized on a small plaque near the organ.

Many of our youth currently play a variety of musical instruments and sing in choirs in their schools. Piano is probably the most common instrument played. It would be an honor to all to have some of these young adults play hymns during church services on a beautiful organ for all to enjoy. Additionally, the organ is needed for weddings, church choir and special events.
